KEYNOTE SPEAKER, ROSALIND BREWER

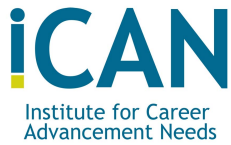
Nobody finds themselves at the top of the corporate ladder by blending in. Individuals must learn to ask the right questions, when to say yes, and most importantly, when to say no.

“It’s all about the power of no,” said Rosalind Brewer, division president of Southeast Operations for Wal-Mart.

Brewer is one of the keynote speakers at this year’s ICAN Women’s Leadership Conference in Omaha, Nebraska. Suze Orman, the country’s guru on financial wellness will also speak at the conference.

Registration for the conference opened on February 9. Brewer joined Wal-Mart in 2006 as Regional Vice President of Georgia Operations. She was promoted to Division President of the Southeast Operating Division in 2007. The Southeast Division consists of 800 stores and 250,000 associates. She is responsible for the strategic direction of all growth opportunities including new real estate, execution of store innovation and people development.



“Diversification and networking are important parts of corporate leadership,” Brewer said.

Prior to joining Wal-Mart, Brewer held leadership positions in various marketing, sales, and product development organizations. She served as the 2001 Campaign Manager for the United Way at Kimberly-Clark Corporation. She is a member of the Johnnetta B. Cole Leadership Society of United Way and the Executive Leadership Council.

Brewer currently serves on the Board of Councilors for the Carter-Presidential Center and holds a seat on the Board of Directors for the Molson Coors Brewing Co. She is also a member of the Board of Trustees at Spelman College and the Woodruff Arts Center.
